New sculpture dedicated to those who built the city

A new addition to the city park's flower garden has been added. This time a statue by local metalwork artist Frank Bach.

"Mickie Hansen talked to me a while back about using one of my statues in the city park," Bach said. "Many of those statutes in my yard though are deeply personal items for me, and really too small for the job. Instead, I told Mickie about an idea I've been kicking around for a while for a new sculpture, though I didn't have the funds to pursue it. Mickie told me that the Beautification Committee didn't really have the funds either. But she brought the idea to both the Arts Council and the Lions Club, and between the two of them they were able to underwrite the materials I needed to get started."

"This statue has been on my mind for quite some time," Bach said. "The railroad and the history of the city are tied together. Faulkton really owes its existence to the railroad, or we'd all

On Monday night the process was repeated when Faulkton Mayor Tim Bormann, witnessed by Carlos' wife Justine, declared Saturday, June 30, 2012 as Carlos Sunne Day in Faulkton.
