NCFE plans new facility open house

The public will have the opportunity to view North Central Farmers Elevator's (NCFE) new facility east of Faulkton at an open house this Thursday, June 21 from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Ground for the new plant was broken in October and because of a mild winter it rarely halted.

Construction continues on the grain handling structures being built south of the completed buildings. The agronomy portion of the project is mostly completed.

Basically the facility will handle a wide range of agronomy needs along with grain handling for corn and beans (wheat and sunflowers will continue to be stored at the Faulkton elevator complex).

The largest structure, partially shown in the background above, is 60'x200'. The main portion of

that building contains liquid fertilizer on the north end (which has a heated floor) and a cold storage area in the center. Offices are on the south end with reception and agronomy offices on the ground floor and grain handling offices, a break room and meeting room on the second story.

Chris Geiger with the agronomy department listed plant capacities as:

- 105,000 gallons of liquid fertilizer total storage.
- Three 5,000 gallon bulk tanks for Roundup RT3, Roundup PowerMax and Class Act chemical tanks.
- A 4,000 gallon bulk Extreme tank.
- A 3,000 gallon bulk Harness Extra tank.
- Four 5,000 unit bulk soybean seed bins.
- Six 120 ton dry fertilizer

bins.

Grain handling will begin on the second floor where large windows overlook a 120' ft. scale. Grain probing will be done there and the scale can accommodate a semi with a pup all in one weighing operation.

Hutchinson listed the grain handling facilities being built as:

- Three 270,000 bushel steel bins (70 feet to the eaves).
- A 130,000 bushel wet bin with dryer.
- A 1,000,000 bushel piler grain storage.

NCFE currently has 15 full and part time employees at the Faulkton facilities.

"We are looking forward to this opportunity to show off the new facility at Faulkton and hope that you can come out and see us this Thursday," Hutchinson said. More pictures on page 6.
