All this will soon become the city's new storm sewer

Repairs and replacements to the City of Faulkton storm sewer began in earnest this past week. B&B Construction of Aberdeen is doing the work and city officials said that the construction is starting on 7th Avenue and Court Street and continue to 8th and Court, and then to 8th and Pearl Street, in all 3 blocks worth of the down-

town area. The repairs will extend through Highway 212, draining into the lagoon. Work is projected to be completed by Sept. 12.

B&B Construction will also be creating the new access road to the lagoon, with work to be completed by Oct. 15.

Scattered showers, things heating up

Faulkton lucked out with more rain than most this past week with .91 inches in total. It's unfortunately more than most local towns got because rainfall seemed to be hit or miss.
