Events this homecoming week start with two JV football games starting at 4 p.m. on Monday, Sept. 15. Also that Monday evening, starting at 7 p.m. is the FHS coronation celebration.

The FHS girls volleyball team will play two games during the week, first on Tuesday away at Leola but returning for a home game on Thursday against Miller.

Friday is the big day with the parade starting on 1 p.m. and a pep rally at the school following directly after. At 2:45 p.m. is the punt pass and kick event. The Faulkton Volunteer Fire Department will host a tailgate party at 5:30 p.m. and the football game starts at 7 p.m.

Because of the construction project downtown the parade route has been changed. Participants will line up at the Catholic Church parking lot. The parade will move west along Court St. past the school and to 14th Ave. where it will turn south and continue to the Faulkton Senior Living and The Meadows where they will parade through the parking lot, then back on Pearl St. east to 12th Ave. and north to the school.
